Please review the draft ordinance increasing the number of video gaming licenses within the City by one (1) and increasing the number of video terminals by (6)

Currently, the City has nineteen (19) licensed locations with one hundred and six (112) machines.

7-Eleven obtained the Class "E" liquor license on July 26, 2022, and is seeking to acquire the Video Gaming Location License.

The owner has secured a gaming license from the Gaming Board.

Recommended Action: After careful consideration, the Mayor and City Council shall move the draft ordinance to the subsequent Consent Agenda for consideration.

2. <u>Draft Ordinance Decreasing The Number Of Class "E" Liquor Licenses By One</u>

- 2. Mayor Esposito advised City Council that the Arianna's Ribbon cutting ceremony is scheduled for March 16th from 12 p.m. to 4 p.m.

XI. COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE CONSIDERATIONS

1. Presentation By District 88 Superintendent Dr. Jean Barbanente Regarding Updates, News, And Success Of The School District:

District 88 Superintendent Dr. Jean Barbanente spoke to the City Council regarding recent District 88 happenings that included the topics of; an update on their strategic plan, identifying school and educational priorities,

connecting with students, and focusing on career and college preparation. She commented on how they are maintaining a graduation rate of over 90%, transparency throughout the school district they serve, offering internships and apprenticeships, and providing additional extracurricular and athletic opportunities for the students.

Alderwoman Fitzgerald asked about the school district's strategic plan and how long the process was. Alderman Barbari asked how many high schools are within the district. Alderman Greco stated he has a child at Willowbrook High School and enjoys the alerts that are dispersed to the parents. Alderman Rada said he was impressed by the diversity at the school.

2. Amending Ordinance No. 24–05: An Ordinance Establishing An Amnesty Program To Encourage Payment Of Past Due Civil Penalties And Late Fees For Automated Traffic Law Enforcement System Violations:

Mayor Esposito asked City Council to review the amended ordinance needing approval due to a numerical clerical error. He stated that if everyone concurs, it will be voted on at the reconvened meeting.

No questions from the City Council.

3. <u>Discussion Of Uncle Bub's BBQ Proposal For The July 4th Resident Picnic:</u>

Mayor Esposito asked City Council to review the interdepartmental memo regarding the proposed quote from Uncle Bub's BBQ for the July 4th resident picnic. Mayor Esposito stated the quote for this year's picnic came in at \$18,585 and advised City Council that once the tip is added to the total, the final cost would exceed our \$20,000 purchasing threshold.

Assistant to the City Administrator Raffel stated the quoted increase is due to rising food costs and that she ordered the same menu items and quantities as last year. She also shared that she contacted Mission BBQ for a quote, but they advised they would be closed for the holiday and would be unable to cater the event.

Alderman Barbari asked if we had a final count for the number of residents who have attended previous 4th of July events. Alderwoman Fitzgerald wondered if there was a local restaurant that would be interested in hosting the event.

Mayor Esposito asked City Council to review the interdepartmental memo prepared by Interim Finance Director Griffen concerning a scrivener's error that was discovered pertaining to the executed ordinance for the general obligation Bond Series 2012B.

City Attorney Ramello explained that the ordinance contained a typographical error that needed to be addressed and corrected. He stated that DuPage County had caught the error and brought it to the attention of Interim Finance Director Griffin.

AN ORDINANCE CORRECTING A SCRIVENER'S ERROR, ABATING CERTAIN TAX LEVIES AND APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A CERTIFICATE OF REDUCTION OF TAXES HERETOFORE LEVIED FOR THE PAYMENT OF BONDS FOR THE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, SERIES 2012B OF THE CITY OF OAKBROOK TERRACE

WHEREAS, the City of Oakbrook Terrace (the "City") is a home-rule unit of local government under Article VII, Section 6 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and, except as limited by such section, it may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs;

WHEREAS, in addition to its home-rule powers, pursuant to Section 8-1-3 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/8-1-3, the City has the authority to issue general obligation bonds for corporate purposes;

WHEREAS, the amounts levied to pay the Refunded Bonds in and for each of the years prior to 2023 have been collected and received by the City;

WHEREAS, the City has cash on hand in an amount sufficient to pay off and retire the outstanding Refunded Bonds;

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted and approved Ordinance 23-21 entitled An Ordinance Abating Certain Tax Levies and Approving and Authorizing the Execution of a Certificate of Reduction of Taxes heretofore Levied for the Payment of Bonds for the General Obligation Bonds, Series 2012B of the City of Oakbrook Terrace (the "Abatement Ordinance") which had attached thereto a Certificate of Reduction;

WHEREAS, both the Abatement Ordinance and the Certificate of Reduction contained scrivener's errors relating to the years in which the taxes were to be abated;

WHEREAS, the City Council desires, by the adoption and approval of this ordinance, to correct the scrivener's errors contained in both the Abatement Ordinance and the Certificate of Reduction;

WHEREAS, it is advisable, necessary and in the public interest that the City abate, in their entirety, the taxes heretofore levied for the years 2023 (collectible in 2024) through and including 2029 (collectible in 2030), inclusive, for the payment of the Refunded Bonds described above as follows (and for avoidance of doubt, the entire remaining levy attributable to the Refunded Bonds is to be abated):

WHEREAS, it is advisable, necessary and in the public interest that the City approve and authorize the execution and filing with the DuPage County Clerk of a Certificate of Reduction of Taxes heretofore Levied for the Payment of Bonds for the General Obligation Bonds, Series 2012B of the City of Oakbrook Terrace, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Oakbrook Terrace, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: The facts and statements contained in the preambles to this ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this ordinance.

Section 2: The City Council does hereby abate, in their entirety, the taxes heretofore levied for the years 2023 (collectible in 2024) through and including 2029 (collectible in 2030), inclusive, for the payment of the Refunded Bonds described above as follows (and for avoidance of doubt, the entire remaining levy attributable to the Refunded Bonds is to be abated):

Section 3: The Mayor shall be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute and the City Clerk shall be and is hereby authorized and directed to attest on behalf of the City the Certificate of Reduction of Taxes heretofore Levied for the Payment of Bonds for the General Obligation Bonds, Series 2012B of the City of Oakbrook Terrace, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof.

Section 4: Upon the adoption of this ordinance, the Finance Director shall file a certified copy of the Certificate of Reduction of Taxes heretofore Levied for the Payment of Bonds for the General Obligation Bonds, Series 2012B of the City of Oakbrook Terrace with the County Clerk of

DuPage County, Illinois; and it shall be the duty of said County Clerk to abate said taxes levied for the years 2023 (collectible in 2024) through and including 2029 (collectible in 2030), inclusive, for the payment of the Refunded Bonds described above in accordance with the provisions hereof.

Section 5: All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent or in conflict herewith shall be, and the same are, hereby repealed solely to the extent of said inconsistency or conflict.

Section 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval in accordance with law.





AN ORDINANCE DECREASING THE NUMBER OF CLASS "E" LIQUOR LICENSES BY ONE (1), PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE XI (BUSINESS REGULATIONS); CHAPTER 111 (FOOD AND BEVERAGES); SUBCHAPTER ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR CONTROL, SECTION 111.012 (NUMBER OF LICENSES IN EACH LICENSE CLASSIFICATION), OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OAKBROOK TERRACE, ILLINOIS, AS AMENDED (LAKHANY OAKBROOK TERRACE, LLC D/B/A STAYBRIDGE SUITES)

WHEREAS, the City of Oakbrook Terrace (the "City") is a home-rule unit of local government under Article VII, Section 6 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and, except as limited by such Section, it may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs;

WHEREAS, Section 111.018 of the Code of Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois (the "City Code") provides that any licensee who has ceased to do business or closes its place of business for a period of more than 30 successive days, without written permission therefor from the Liquor Commissioner, shall be subject to having its license declared forfeited or lapsed by order of the Liquor Commissioner;

WHEREAS, Lakhany Oakbrook Terrace, LLC doing business as Staybridge Suites, 200 Royce Blvd., Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois (the "Licensee") has ceased to do business or closed its place of business for a period of more than 30 successive days without written permission therefor from the Liquor Commissioner, and is subject to having its license declared forfeited or lapsed by order of the Liquor Commissioner pursuant to Section 111.018 of the City Code;

WHEREAS, the Liquor Commissioner has ordered the Licensee's Class "E" liquor license forfeited and has notified the City Council of the forfeiture of the Licensee's license, a copy of which Order is attached hereto, marked as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof;

WHEREAS, Section 111.012 of the City Code provides that the total number of liquor licenses may be increased or decreased from time to time, by the adoption of an ordinance amending the City Code, in the discretion of the City Council upon failure of the Licensee to renew its liquor license, or upon notice from the Liquor Commissioner that a liquor license has been declared forfeited or lapsed pursuant to section 111.018 of the City Code, or that a liquor license has been revoked by order of the Liquor Commissioner pursuant to Section 111.037 of the City Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is necessary to decrease the number of Class "E" liquor licenses that authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquors for consumption only on the licensed premises, including restaurants, cocktail lounges, and hotels due to the forfeiture or lapse of the Licensee 's license;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Oakbrook Terrace, DuPage County, Illinois as follows:

Section 1: The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein by this reference.

- Section 2: Pursuant to Section 111.012 (Number of Licenses in Each License Classification) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Oakbrook Terrace, the number of Class "E" liquor licenses to be issued in the City is hereby decreased by one (1), decreasing the total number of Class "E" liquor licenses to be issued in the City to twelve (12).
- <u>Section 3:</u> Title XI (Business Regulations), Chapter 111 (Food and Beverages), Subchapter Alcoholic Liquor Control, Section 111.012 (Number of Licenses in Each License Classification), of the City's Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 111.012 NUMBER OF LICENSES IN EACH LICENSE CLASSIFICATION.

- (A) The total number of liquor licenses of all classes (except Class C) issued under this subchapter shall not exceed the sum of all classes, and as further restricted to the following totals by classes:
 - (1) The total number of Class A licenses shall not exceed twenty-one.
 - (2) The total number of Class B licenses shall not exceed five.
 - (3) The total number of Class C licenses shall be limited pursuant to § 111.009(C).
 - (4) The total number of Class D licenses shall not exceed zero.
 - (5) The total number of Class E licenses shall not exceed twelve.
 - (6) The total number of Class F licenses shall not exceed one.
 - (7) The total number of Class H licenses shall not exceed zero.
 - (8) The total number of Class I licenses shall not exceed one.
 - (9) The total number of Class J licenses shall not exceed one.
 - (10) The total number of Class K licenses shall not exceed zero.
 - (11) The total number of Class L licenses shall not exceed two.
 - (12) The total number of Class N licenses shall not exceed zero.
 - (13) The total number of Class O licenses shall not exceed zero.
 - (14) The total number of Class P licenses shall not exceed zero.
 - (15) The total number of Class Q licenses shall not exceed zero.
- (B) The total number of licenses may be increased or decreased from time to time, by the adoption of an ordinance amending this code, in the discretion of the City Council as follows:
 - (1) Pursuant to § 111.007(B), upon the recommendation of the Commissioner concerning an applied-for license of a particular classification;
 - (2) Upon failure of a licensee to renew its license, or upon notice from the Commissioner that a license has been declared forfeited or lapsed pursuant to §

111.018 of this subchapter, or that a license has been revoked by order of the Commissioner pursuant to § 111.037 of this subchapter.

Section 4: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

Section 5: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

Resolution of the Village of Glen Ellyn Board of Trustees Reaffirming Its Support for a Community Free of Racism, Hatred and Bigotry in All Forms.

WHEREAS, the United States of America is a civilized nation that in its Declaration of Independence declares that all people are created equal; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Glen Ellyn strives to be an inclusive community that champions diversity, embraces its immigrant communities, respects sexual and gender identity, makes room for all faiths, pursues equity, and rejects hatred, violence, and terrorism; and

WHEREAS, disagreements can occur respectfully without resorting to, or threatening, violence, and without defacing or destroying property;

WHEREAS, the idea that one group or individual is supreme over another is not only wrong but ethically and morally reprehensible; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Village of Glen Ellyn that the Village will:

SECTION 1. Denounce all forms of hate by any group or individual;

SECTION 2. Continue to exercise its fundamental freedoms, including freedom of expression, assembly, and conscience; and

SECTION 3. Shall not be intimidated by the fear of violence by any group or individual that seeks to empower themselves over others; and

SECTION 4. Shall strive to be a community of justice and peace for all people where the dignity of every human being is respected.
