
Finally, let me say, I'm proud and honored to be your Mayor. I take this position seriously and personally and I will always be available to residents at any time.

of Oakbrook Terrace is partnering with Nixle to implement its Community Notification System to alert residents in real-time for localized emergency situations and community advisories.



Recycling and Shredding Event: Saturday, June 19

The City will be holding a Recycling and Shredding event for residents only on Saturday, June 19, from 9 a.m. to 12 noon, in the parking lot of City Hall, 17W275 Butterfield Road, Oakbrook Terrace.

Documents Shredding

Residents can bring up to six file-sized boxes or paper bags of sensitive documents containing personal information, such as medical history forms, bank statements, personal files and retired tax forms. Paper documents will be shredded on site. Plastic spines/covers and metal clips/binders MUST BE removed

from all documents. DO NOT bring paper in plastic bags. DO NOT include photos, slides, negatives, books, store receipts, magazines, greeting cards or newspapers or any non-paper items.

Electronics Recycling

Flood Brothers will be collecting the following electronics: televisions (maximum 2), computers, laptops, servers, computer monitors, printers, faxes, scanners, VCR & DVD players, video game consoles and cell phones. Household appliances and hazardous waste cannot be accepted.

Property Maintenance

The City of Oakbrook Terraces establishes minimum standards for all property within the City to protect the health, safety and welfare of citizens. These standards are enforced by the City Property Maintenance Inspector through a process called property maintenance code enforcement.

The Building and Zoning Department is available to help residents understand how to become compliant with these standards. Some of the issues addressed in property maintenance include exterior maintenance of all buildings and property areas, garbage and refuse disposal, grass and weed control, as well as maintenance of garages, sheds, fences and driveways.

Beginning May 1, the City of Oakbrook Terrace will be conducting a yearly compliance program of all single family residential properties within the community. City staff will be inspecting properties from the right-of-way, and residents will receive a courtesy notice door hanger thanking residents who are complying or advising a homeowner of any problems found by City staff. It that occurs, homeowners will be asked to address the issues by a specific date. Failure to comply will result in further action by the City. The City of Oakbrook Terrace thanks residents for their continued cooperation in helping to keep our community looking its best.

Do You Need A Permit?

Spring is upon us and home improvement projects are scheduled to begin. Residents are reminded that many types of building and renovation projects require a building permit. Permit applications can be downloaded from the City website at www.oakbrookterrace.net.

Work started prior to securing a building permit could result in fines

and an appearance in court. Once a building permit has been secured, the homeowner is required to clearly post the permit either in the front window or door of the building structure.

Many common projects that require a building permit include concrete and asphalt work, brick paving, masonry, electrical, plumbing, roofs, siding, fences, A/C units, sheds, swimming pools, decks, and porches. Before you begin any project, the City strongly suggests calling the Building and Zoning Department to verify permitting requirements.

Child Car Seat Safety Tips

The Oakbrook Terrace Police Department conducts child car seat safety checks. This service is for Oakbrook Terrace residents only and is free of charge. Safety Seat checks are by appointment only. Please contact Community Service Officer Jacky Caruso at 630-941-8320 to make an appointment.

Following are some important reminders about car seats and keeping your children safe:

- Select a car seat that fits a child's age and size and that can be safely secured in your vehicle.
- Keep children in a rear-facing safety seat until they're at least age two.

Police Department New Hours: 7 am - 11 pm • Closed weekends

The Oakbrook Terrace Police Department is no longer open 24 hours a day and is now open 7 a.m. - 11 p.m. and closed on Saturday and Sunday. If an outsider needs help, there is a phone in the vestibule of the Police Department that automatically calls 911.

- Never install a rear-facing seat in front of an active airbag.
- Keep children in the back seat until they reach age 13.
- Know the history of your safety seat.
- Do not use a safety seat that is more than six years old or past the expiration date stamped on the seat.
- Register your safety seat with the manufacturer, so you will be notified of any recalls. Check for recalls at safercar.gov.
- Do not attach anything to the car safety seat unless the manufacturer permits it, including toys, mirrors, window shades and belt-tightening tools.
- All objects in the vehicle should be stowed in the trunk or tied down. They can be projectiles if a crash or sudden stop occurs.

Oakbrook Terrace Water System Is Lead-Free

Approximately 25 years ago, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) published the Lead and Copper Rule (LCR) to control lead and copper in our drinking water. The reason for the rule is that lead and copper negatively affect our health.

What is not widely understood outside of water treatment and regulatory communities is that the LCR's action level is not a health-based limit, but rather a trigger for water providers to implement treatment options, which include water quality practices that help stabilize the water and prevent a corrosive environment. The LCR was developed to protect the end users, but the simple fact is that as long as there are lead pipes in the ground or lead plumbing in the home, some risk remains.

In light of the recent incidents in Flint Michigan, lead in drinking water has risen to the front page of most news outlets. These stories have caused concerns with our customer base concerning the safety of the water we provide on a daily basis. Here at Oakbrook Terrace, we can reassure our customers that the City's water is safe to drink and exceeds all EPA regulatory standards as it enters your homes.

The source water for the Oakbrook Terrace water system is Lake Michigan. As the water passes through the James W. Jardine Water Treatment Plant and flows through the City of Chicago's tunnel system on its journey to Oakbrook Terrace, the water does not pick-up any detectable concentrations of lead. T

The City of Oakbrook Terrace water supply was never supplied by groundwater wells, so our distribution water pipes have never had any contact with any source lead since they were installed, which is just another safeguard to our water supply.

2021 Brush Pick-Up Dates

May 17 June 7 & 28 July 12 August 2 & 23 September 13 October 4 & 25 The City of Chicago routinely tests the source water and water in their transmission system for lead and a variety of other possible contaminant,s in addition to their LCR required sampling. Oakbrook Terrace also performs this test with undetectable results Sources of lead in drinking water are primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. The City of Oakbrook Terrace has zero lead service lines.

Please drink and utilize the water the City of Oakbrook Terrace provides with confidence.

Outdoor Water Conservation Tips

- Detect and repair all leaks in irrigation systems.
- Water the lawn or garden during the coolest part of the day; avoid watering on windy days.
- Water trees and shrubs which have deep root systems
 — longer and less frequently than shallow-rooted plants,
 which require smaller amounts of water more often.
- Set sprinklers to water the lawn and garden only not the street or sidewalk.
- Use soaker hoses and trickle irrigation systems.

Planting and Maintaining

- Use native plants in your landscape. They require less care and water than ornamental varieties.
- Use mulch around shrubs and garden plants to reduce evaporation from the soil and cut down on weed growth.
- Remove thatch and aerate turf to encourage movement of water to the root zone.
- Raise your lawn mower cutting height. Longer grass blades help shade each other, which cuts down on evaporation and inhibits weed growth.

Oakbrook Terrace Private Security Camera Rebate Program

The City of Oakbrook Terrace offers a Private Security Camera Rebate Program for residents of owner-occupied, detached, singlefamily homes and detached townhomes located within the City where the property is used as the owner's primary residence. The program provides a rebate of up to \$150 per camera system per residential address. The rebate is exclusively for the cost of the security camera(s) and installation, including any applicable taxes. Rebates will only be given for cameras that are installed on the exterior of the property and for the amount that was paid at the time of application. For information, visit oakbrookterrace.net.

Villa Park Library Card

As of May 1, 2021, the annual fee for a Villa Park library card is \$44 per multi-family household (living in apartments such as Versailles and Regency Place) and \$54 per single-family household (including Spring Club, Berkshire and Arbor 40, as well as all other single-family households) through April 30, 2022. Water Bill Payments

The City accepts Visa, MasterCard and Discover for payment of water bills. In addition, there are other ways to pay your Oakbrook Terrace water bill: have it debited automatically from your checking account, mail it in, or drop your payment into the convenient drop-box located at the Butterfield Road entrance to City Hall. You can also now pay your water bill over the phone with a credit card by calling. 630-941-8300, ext. 242, or pay online by visiting www.oakbrookterrace.net. If paying by mail, please send it no less than five mailing days before the due date to avoid a penalty for late payment. Please note that water bills are now mailed to residents on a bi-monthly basis. IF YOU ARE MOVING, please call City Hall at 630-941-8300, ext. 242, to schedule a final reading.
