A Message From the Mayor



I would like to remind everyone that our schools are back in session, so please use caution while driving on our streets. Pay close attention especially to the children who are entering and exiting the school buses, and always stop when the school bus stop signs are displayed.

Our police department has been enforcing traffic violations throughout the City, specifically 22nd and MacArthur, due to Costco and the new Overlook of Oak Brook development coming soon. Our streets will be monitored for through traffic on Hodges and Monterey, and 16th and Leahy.

I would like to report an update regarding the status of the City's Red Light camera. Judge Belford of the 18th Judicial Circuit Court of DuPage County, granted the City's Motion to Stay the Decision of the Illinois Department of Transportation. The City is hereby authorized to reactivate the automated traffic law enforcement systems located at Route 83 and 22nd Street in the City. The safety of our residents and the traveling public is our number one priority. Judge Belford's decision, reinstating the city's right to operate its automated traffic law enforcement systems, is a significant step toward achieving that goal.

I would like to thank our Police Department for hosting National Night Out. It was great to see residents and children turn out for this annual event. Thank you to our sponsors, Frankie's Deli, Giordano's, Tapicozza's, Tijuana Flats, Rainbow Cone, and Flood Brothers.

I would like to thank the residents who attended the Streambank Special City Council meeting on August 20. The project will move forward in phases, with direction from the City Council, staff, and residents.

Public Services

2022 Curb and Gutter Project

The City of Oakbrook Terrace has awarded the 2022 Curb and Gutter project to Davis Concrete Construction in the amount of \$191,014.25. Davis Concrete was the lowest responsible bidder and came in \$48,583.75 below the engineering estimate. Work will take place on Elm Ct, Orchard Place, and a southern portion of MacArthur Dr. Work will consist of concrete shoulder removal and installation of concrete curb and gutter. Necessary structure adjustments, pavement patching, as well as landscape restoration will take place within the construction area. The project was approved by IDOT for use of Motor Fuel Tax funds, and we are hoping to start the project in late September or early October of 2022. The project should be completed within 30 days of the start.

Traffic Safety Survey

Members of the Oakbrook Terrace Police Department have been conducting directed patrols for speed limit and stop sign compliance in the City's residential areas. The details and results of these directed patrols are below.

The intersections of Monterey Avenue and Wainwright Road, Stillwell Road and Elder Lane, and Stillwell Road and Leahy Road were periodically monitored for stop sign compliance between June 15, 2022, and July 15, 2022. During that time, 949 vehicles were observed approaching those intersections. Of those 949 vehicles, 97% of them obeyed the stop signs.

Wainwright Road was periodically monitored for speed limit compliance between June 6, 2022 and June 13, 2022. During that time, 276 vehicles were observed traveling on Wainwright Road. The average speed of those 276 vehicles was 18.01 miles per hour in a 25 mile per hour zone.

Southbound MacArthur Drive was monitored for speed limit compliance between April 17, 2018 and June 15, 2022. During that time, 837,635 vehicles were observed traveling south on MacArthur Drive. The average speed of those 837,635 vehicles was 21.42 miles per hour in a 25 mile per hour zone.

Northbound MacArthur Drive was monitored for speed limit compliance between April 17, 2018 and June 16, 2022. During that time, 301,562 vehicles were observed traveling north on MacArthur Drive. The average speed of those 301,562 vehicles was 20.92 miles per hour in a 25 mile per hour zone.

We would like to thank you for your compliance and ask that you continue to obey the speed limit, stop at the stop signs, be cognizant of and slow down for pedestrians and bicyclists, and reduce distractions such as cell phones and loud music while traveling through the City.

Trick or Treating Safety

The Oakbrook Terrace Police Department offers these tips to keep your children safe on Halloween. Children should:

#1 Walk Safely

- Cross the street at corners AND look both ways!
- Put electronic devices down and keep heads up as you cross the street.
- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up.
- NEVER cross the street between two parked cars.

#2 Trick or Treat With an Adult

• Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision.

#3 Keep Costumes Both Creative and Safe

- Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors.
- Choose face paint and makeup whenever possible instead of masks, which can obstruct a child's vision.
- Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.



#4 Drive Extra Safely on Halloween

- Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods.
- Enter and exit driveways slowly and carefully.
- Drive slowly and anticipate heavy pedestrian traffic. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.

Oakbrook Terrace Pet Regulations

All dogs and cats residing in Oakbrook Terrace must be vaccinated for rabies and owners must have a rabies vaccination tag, typically provided by the veterinarian at the time of the vaccination. In addition, City ordinance requires that pets be leashed when not enclosed on their own property. As a courtesy, please respect your neighbors and clean up after your pet and do not let your pet run on the property of others. To help protect your pet in the event that it is lost, you may register it with the Oakbrook Terrace Police Department with your contact information, needed information about the pet and your pet's photo.

Oakbrook Terrace Private Security Camera Rebate Program

The City of Oakbrook Terrace offers a Private Security Camera Rebate Program for residents of owner-occupied, detached, single-family homes and detached townhomes located within the City where the property is used as the owner's primary residence. The program provides a rebate of up to \$150 per camera system per residential address. The rebate is exclusively for the cost of the security camera(s) and installation, including any applicable taxes. Rebates will only be given for cameras that are installed on the exterior of the property and for the amount that was paid at the time of application. For information, visit oakbrookterrace.net.

Villa Park Library Card

As of May 1, 2022, the annual fee for a Villa Park library card is \$45 per multi-family household (living in apartments such as Versailles and Regency Place) and \$55 per single-family household (including Spring Club, Berkshire and Arbor 40, as well as all other single-family households) through April 30, 2023. The library card provides access to all of the library's resources. For more information, please visit www. villapark.lib.il.us/.

Water Bill Payments

The City accepts Visa, MasterCard and Discover for payment of water bills. In addition, there are other ways to pay your Oakbrook Terrace water bill: have it debited automatically from your checking account, mail it in, or drop your payment into the convenient drop-box located at the Butterfield Road entrance to City Hall. You can also now pay your water bill over the phone with a credit card by calling. 630-941-8300, ext. 242, or pay online by visiting www.oakbrookterrace.net. If paying by mail, please send it no less than five mailing days before the due date to avoid a penalty for late payment.
